Notes from the Pastor

“Starting Over” Jeremiah 18:1-10

Have you ever watched a potter make a vessel? It is fascinating, isn't it? He takes a clump of clay, puts it on a spinning wheel, adds water and imagination and molds it into a beautiful and useful vessel. The finished product is usually a work of art that brightens any room.

Jeremiah paid a visit to a potter, not to buy a vessel but learn a valuable lesson. It had such an impact upon him that he shared this experience and lesson with others, including us. Let's unwrap this gift from him this morning.

Who was Jeremiah? He was an Old Testament prophet that was born six hundred fifty years before Christ. He was upset with his people because he felt they had lost their way. They were not honoring the covenant they made with God to be a people of integrity, compassion, peace and humility. Instead, they adopted the culture's values and became greedy, selfish, power hungry and complacent.

In addition, they refused to listen to Jeremiah, subjecting him to ridicule and abuse. As a result, Jeremiah questioned God about his pain and asked why he had to suffer. He begged God to take revenge upon his enemies and vindicate him.

What was Jeremiah instructed to do? He was told to go to the potter's house and watch him make pottery.

Why was he told to do this? It was at the potter's house that he would receive a message from God.

Now you would think that he would be sent to the temple, Solomon's Temple, to receive a word from the Lord. Why was he sent to the potter's house instead? The message he needed to

receive would be learned by observing the sights and sounds around him. God would use everyday people doing ordinary things to speak to Jeremiah, just as He does for us.

What did Jeremiah observe? He watched as the potter took a clump of clay and

began molding a vessel on the spinning wheel. All went well until an imperfection in the clay spoiled it and the potter could no longer continue.

So what did he do? Did he throw the clay away and grab a fresh clump of clay? No, he did not. He continued to work with the same clump of clay until it was transformed into a useful vessel.

What did Jeremiah learn from this experience? I think he learned a valuable lesson about the redeeming, healing, renewing power of grace. He did not need to give up on his people because God had not. God still loved them and was willing to work with them to make the world better, and so should Jeremiah. Even God's judgment was redemptive.

Jeremiah learned that belonging to God affected the way he belonged to those around him. It demanded that he be a suffering servant that would keep trying to find ways to redeem the fallen and restore those that had lost their way.

What can we learn from Jeremiah's experience? Belonging to God affects the way we belong to each other, too. Becoming suffering servants for the purpose of restoring the fallen is our mission and purpose.

This leads to two questions I would like for you to ponder today, and the first is this. **On whom are you thinking about giving up?** Who has hurt you to the point you want to walk away and never look back?

What would it take for you to reconsider? Do you think God will provide it? I do because His passion is helping people overcome mistakes so they can rebuild their lives. You will not be alone on this mission of mercy nor will you lack for patience, understanding, willpower and love. If you ask, He will supply these needs and use you as an agent of healing and restoration.

Wasn't this Jesus' mission? Didn't he come to seek and save those that were lost? I'm sure you recall his response to the Pharisees when they criticized him for associating with sinners. "It is not the healthy that need a doctor but the sick. Go and learn what this means. I desire mercy, not sacrifice. For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners" Matthew 9:12.

Shouldn't this be our mission, too? Doesn't it begin with those closest to us? I think it does.

The second question is for those that have made mistakes and hurt others. **How do you need to respond to those that are reaching out to help you?** What do you need to do to be redeemed and heal the wounds you have caused?

Let me suggest that you place your life in the hands of people that love you and want to help you. You need to be as pliable as that clump of clay in the potter's hand and cooperate with family, friends, ministers and counselors that are trying to help you. Don't become defensive and harden your heart. This would be disastrous. Humbly place your life in the hands of those that believe in you, care for you and want the best for you and trust them, with God's help, to lead you in new directions.

I have always appreciated the response of the person, who when asked, "Have you been born again?" astutely replied, "Oh yes, I have been born again and again and again and again." That's the most appropriate answer I have ever heard. I believe that is what this story is all about, starting over after we have failed.

Do you need to be born again this morning? Have you lost your way and need to be found? Have you made some critical mistakes and need to be forgiven? Have you fallen and need to be restored?

Do you need to help someone that has lost her way? Do you need patience, wisdom, understanding, willpower and love? Do you need a reason not to give up on someone?

Perhaps you need to go to the potter's house and watch him work. He's used to people showing up and will be ready for you.

A Giving Opportunity during the Gift-Giving Season

We have entered the season of giving. What a wonderful season it is!

Gifts can be made in many different ways. You may be interested to learn of a new provision in the law for those who are 70^{1/2} or older and who must take unneeded taxable distributions from a traditional IRA or Roth IRA.

In August 2006, the President signed the Pension Protection Act. The new law allows you to direct your annual mandatory withdrawal amount (up to \$100,000) to be used to make charitable gifts on a totally tax-free basis.

If you are 70^{1/2} or older and your retirement assets are held in another type of account such as a 401(k), you may be able to transfer those assets to an IRA account first and then give them on a tax-free basis.

Because you will not be taxed on the money rolled over from your IRA directly to a charity, you will not receive a charitable deduction for this type of gift.
